#### Niles Schulz Teacher, Coach, Mentor

Niles Schulz came to Edison High School in 1966 after graduating from Augsburg College to teach English. He taught at Edison until 1985 when he retired and began a new career as a contractor and volunteer extraordinaire. Niles was a successful coach for both football and wrestling and was a popular teacher as well. Niles loved the written and spoken word and introduced decades of students to Dickens, Twain and of course his favorite poet Robert Frost. He was an avid reader and enjoyed sharing his love of books and favorite authors as often as possible. Niles lived and worked Northeast. He and his wife Jane, daughters, Sarah and Claire and son Daniel were constant fixtures in the greater Northeast community. Niles served on the board of the Edison Community & Sports Foundation for 25 years and particularly enjoyed interviewing scholarship recipients. He spent time with the student and challenged them to be their very best. Niles also chaired the Distinguished Alumni selection committee and was Vice President of the ECSF Board.

Bernie Kunza, head varsity baseball coach said he was blessed spending time with Niles and reflected, "We talked for hours and he would tell stories of the good times at Edison. While he graduated from Zumbrota High School, Niles was a Tommie through and through. What a delightful, caring man and yes, a legendary coach." Jeff Moritko, Class of 1980 said, "I have been very fortunate to have a number of great male role models and mentors while growing up. Second only



to my father was Niles Schulz. He provided great stability for me during my formative, sometimes awkward, often erratic adolescent years." In addition to his work on the ECSF Board, he was also active in PFLAG and PFUND and volunteered at Pratt Community School in Minneapolis, his grandson Richard's school. "Mr. Niles" was a popular helper and worked on improving literacy for many students at Pratt. Niles also loved bicycling and participated in many AIDS Rides. Niles passed away in July at the age of 74 in a canoeing accident in his beloved Boundary Waters Canoe Area. He is survived by wife, Jane; daughters Sara, Claire (Cal) and

Daniel; grandchildren, Caroline, Adam and Richard; brothers Dave (Kay), Ted (Sue), Chuck (Dorothy), and Lee (Julie); sister-in-law, Betty (Don) and many, many friends.

A Celebration of Niles' Life was held on Sunday, August 12<sup>th</sup> at Edison and then at the Solar Arts Building. The event was attended by more than 800 people and featured speakers from many aspects of

Attendees at this year's May Scholarship Dinner recognized two deserving individuals into the Edison Distinguished Alumni club. Both gave inspiring speeches about their time at Edison, the fine foundations growing up Northeast gave them in preparing for their futures and their love for the greater Edison Community.

Rita Andresik not only graduated from Edison, she also taught music at Edison for nearly 20 years. Rita's high energy and great reputation also allowed her to serve as dance line advisor, cheerleading advisor and to develop and find financing for many Broadway plays while at Edison.

Rita began her acceptance by proclaiming "My whole life has been Edison" and then drew her audience in with an acapella and moving version of "What a Wonderful World". Rita commands the room and she transformed the space to her own personal stage. Our audience was mesmerized. Edison is so fortunate to have such a passionate and talented woman as an alumna.

Don't be surprised when Rita drops in at your class reunion! She loves to surprise former students and find out what people are doing with their lives. And you can always count on Rita to attend most Edison alum functions and she is even willing to lead the crowd into Blue Gold. Her effervescent personality encompasses the spirit of Edison.

Jim Mastro is an inspiration to all who know or who have met him. Jim was born blind in one eye and then due to a childhood injury, lost vision in his other eye at age 17. Blindness proved to not stop Jim one bit and he proceeded to participate and coach wrestling and sports for much of his adult life.

After Edison, Jim went onto Augsburg College where he won the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference 177-pound wrestling title. He was an alternate on the U.S. Olympic Greco-Roman wrestling squad at the 1976 Montreal Games. He competed on six U.S. Paralympics teams and many blind international wrestling teams. He won medals in wrestling, judo, shot put, discus and received the Medal of Courage from the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2008.

Jim spoke about his time at Edison and coaching in the Northeast community warmly. Many former Tommie wrestlers were in attendance and enjoyed sharing memories with Jim. He is truly a bundle of energy and enthusiasm!

Jim earned a Ph.D. in adapted and developmental physical education and was a professor at Bemidji (Minn.) State University. Jim is married to his wife, Cheryl and they have two children.
