

New in 2019! Niles Schulz

In addition to the Annual Scholarships awarded to students, we have a new scholarship in honor of Niles Schulz. Two students, one female and one male will each be awarded a scholarship in the amount of \$3,000 by meeting the scholarship criteria. These awards are payable to the Scholarship Recipients for further disbursement to a post-high school educational institution.

The criteria is for any student with a minimum GPA of 2.5 or greater, who has been an active participant in the life of Edison High School and the Edison Community over the years the student has been at Edison. In addition, the student should show dedication to academics with interest focused study in humanities (literature, composition, poetry, etc.), an all-around participation in school activities such as athletics, music, theater, government, clubs, volunteer activity (eg: social justice groups) in their communities, etc. The student must be enrolled in a post-high school educational institution or career program.



**Edison Class of 1965 Remembers a Classmate after 50 years
Wesley Hendrickson Memorial Scholarship - \$2,000 for 2019**

Wes Hendrickson - 1965

Nearing the 50th anniversary of Wes' death in Vietnam, the Edison Class of 1965 would like to honor his service and sacrifice, as well as the service of others of our classmates who served bravely in Vietnam. The Class of 1965 wishes to provide a Scholarship in Wes's memory to a deserving student at Edison High School.



Nearly 50 years ago, a 1969 an Edison High School graduate from the class of 1965, was killed in Vietnam. On February 12, 1969, First Lieutenant Wes Hendrickson was shot and killed by sniper fire while rescuing wounded men from an attack. He served in Company B, 1st Battalion, 27th Infantry (Wolfhounds), 25th Infantry Division and died in Bin Duong Province in South Vietnam.

Posthumously, Wes was awarded a Bronze Star with two oak leaf clusters, a Purple Heart and the Combat Infantryman Badge. He is buried at Fort Snelling National Cemetery.

In high school, Wes was a talented athlete, participating in track, wrestling and gymnastics. He was a popular student who was elected our Snow King in 1965. He was a member of E-Club, band and acted in our class play. Wes was good-hearted, kind and a happy guy.

Edison Scholarship Committee shall select a recipient for 2019 and 2020 in accordance with the following selection criteria, characteristics that Wesley exemplified: Genuine intellectual curiosity and love of learning; Demonstrated citizenship and leadership qualities; Participation in athletics, especially individual sports such as track, wrestling, gymnastics; Contributed to the life of the school through extracurricular activities, including theater, class plays, band, and class activities; and, Motivation and work ethic as evidenced by GPA and teacher recommendations. Wes's sister Ruth (Hendrickson) Bills graduated from Edison in 1959.

Contributions for the Wes Hendrickson Scholarship are still being accepted.

Letter from President Iacarella



Greetings Fellow Tommies and Friends of Edison,

It has been a brutal February of snow and cold, but it won't be too long and those memories of 10 foot high snow drifts and bone chilling temperatures will be a thing in the past...

Hopefully! Even though the Edison students were able to celebrate 6 snow days, so

far as I am writing, there still has been a lot of things going on at the building. The new solar canopy that will cover the south end of the gym/concession area has went up. This structure will not only contain solar panels to provide electricity, but will trap water from rainfall into an underground cistern where it will be stored and used to irrigate the football field. All that is needed to finish construction is the installation of the panels, which will go up once the weather allows.

Edison will also have a new front entry/lobby area that will start construction in mid-June, once the students are gone for the summer, and then be completed for the beginning of the school year this September. The project will include removing the front planters boxes and creating a more inviting user friendly entry area. There will also be new larger glass doors to enhance the look of the building and the access into the principal's office will be moved to the front entry area. There will also be two new handicap accessible bathrooms right off the main lobby area which will be excellent for use during plays and other building functions so visitors will not have to go all the way down to the other end of the building to use the facilities.

On another note, I want to recognize and thank all the people who have stepped up and helped increase our number of scholarships

and dollars given out this year. In all we are giving out more than \$37,000 this June to deserving Edison students. This number is approximately \$14,000 more then we gave out last year. We are truly blessed to have so many people who care to help make a difference in our youth of today!

With that being said I would like to invite everyone to try and attend our Niles Schulz May Scholarship Dinner at the Solar Arts building on May 6th. It is one of our major fundraisers and is a great way to see the kind of wonderful things we do for the students of Edison. Tickets are only \$175 which includes dinner for two by ChowGirls and a chance at a \$2,000 grand prize. There will also be a silent auction, bingo and other fun activities to make it a full experience for everyone. It is a great night to get out with some old friends and meet some new ones who share the same interests of Northeast and Edison High School.
