

## 1913 Edison Amberola Cylinder Record Player Donated to Edison

Recently I helped friends of mine, Sherrie and Adrienne Blazevic, donate a 1913 Edison Amberola cylinder record player and a few cylinders to Edison. It will end up in a display case with information about Thomas Edison beside it.

Thomas Alva Edison was an American inventor that is credited with 1,093 patents. Among them was the motion picture camera, electric power generation and early versions of the electric light bulb.

In 1878, he invented a patent for capturing sound on tin foil covered cylinders. Improvements to this technology led to the cylinder record player. This particular model is from 1913.

The records were made of wax and there were two different kinds. Amberol Blue and Gold Moulded! The Edison Newspaper – Named "The Record!!" Edison Colors--Blue and Gold!!

## Championship teams 1972 through 1974 honored

Championship teams from 1972 through 1974 were honored at the Hall of Fame dinner. 14 Hall of Fame members, many who were on championship teams, and more champion athletes were in attendance to be honored and reminisce about past achievements.

### Dance line

1972-Dance line wins State Title. There was no formal high school league state competition, but all the competitive teams were present at the Minneapolis Aquatennial competition. The winner was declared by all as the best dance line in the state. Edison bested all the teams in 1972 and declared as the state champions.

### Football

1972-The team was honored as being the last undefeated team in Edison sports history (8-0-1). A final game tie against North kept the team from winning the city crown as Washburn finished with a 9-0 record. The two teams did not play each other due to the number of teams in the conference. The state of Minnesota began playoffs the next year making undefeated seasons a much tougher reality. The team had several outstanding athletes and set the tone for what would be many city football titles for the next 20 years.

1974-The team finished with a 9-1 record losing their last game to St. Paul Harding in the Twin City Championship game. During their 9-0 city title, the team shut out seven of the nine opponents allowing 14 points to be scored against them.

### Wrestling

1972-74-These three years saw Edison win consecutive titles, number 4 through 6, as Edison continued dominance in city and twin city wrestling. The 1972 team scored 426 points for, against 92 points for their opponents as the team finished 11-0. The '73 and '74 teams were also 11-0 in all and both teams shut out an opponent during the year. The 1973 team finished third in the region competition. This was before the high

school league began a team wrestling format which would have been a strong advantage for Edison as the teams included many outstanding wrestlers.

### Baseball

1972 and 1974-The school won City baseball titles and both teams had a record of 9-1. The 1972 team pitched 3 shutouts on their way to the City title. The 1974 team scored 58 runs during the conference against 12 for their opponents and recorded 5 shutouts in conference play.

### Girls Golf

1973-The Golf season was the first year that each school in the conference had a team competing for the city title. The girls team ended the conference schedule with the perfect 12-0 record. The 1974 team was undefeated as well but had a tie against Southwest which made the two teams co-champions.

### Boys Skiing

1972-The boys ski team finished in second place in City competition with a 9-1 record. The team tied for the district title with Roosevelt and competed in the state meet where they took 16<sup>th</sup> place.

We are hoping to add longer narratives to all our athletic achievements when we post information to the Touchpro system at the school. The Hall of Fame committee would like help finding data about past Hall of Fame members and championship teams. If any past "Tommies" are willing to help, please get in touch. The Board is making a push to have good data to record for all to see using the Touchpro system by the Centennial celebration in September. ## Take Time to Honor Edison Veterans

1943 Edison Wizard yearbook, the caption for Richard Edward Kraus says, "A friendly sort of guy..."

On Oct. 5, 1944, Richard (Dick) Kraus was in the Marine Corps serving during the invasion on the Pacific island of Peleliu. He volunteered to help out with a stretcher to rescue a wounded Marine on the front line. An enemy grenade landed in the middle of the rescue party, and without hesitation, Dick Kraus threw himself on the grenade. He saved the lives of his three companions. He was awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest award, for his sacrifice. He was 18 years old.

As Edison High School celebrates 100 years this year, I hope we can take a few minutes to honor the veterans like Dick Kraus who represented our school and defended our nation.

We know that 116 Edison graduates were killed in World War II. It would be nice to know how many gave their lives in the Korean, Vietnam and Gulf wars. and how many served. We should take some time this fall to honor those veterans. 
