



The Edison Authors Reflect on the Past and the Future

The Edison Authors' Committee had good objectives for organizing our group and for writing the three books *Class Backwards*, *Class Forwards*, *and Fast Forwards*. First, we wanted to capture memories of growing up in Northeast and attending Edison High School and record those memories and historical facts in book form. Then, we hoped to use the proceeds from the books to go towards EHS student scholarships.

The quest to collect and enter the stories from various former Edison students, besides our own, started about 15 years ago. This idea came from a small group of us from the Class of 1958. We were motivated to move forward as other graduates from the 50's and other classes were eager to share stories, donate their time to help, and to purchase the books. During this endeavor, we became more aware of the importance of Alumni support. This is one way to positively impact and help deserving Edison graduating students to further their education and maintain Edison as a strong school (which it is!) in NE Minneapolis.

We were delighted with the response and demand from the Edison Alumni of the latest book, *Fast Forwards*, at the Centennial Celebrations. It is a collection of memories and events celebrating Edison's 100 years in NE Minneapolis. After the first printing of *Fast Forwards* sold out during the Centennial Celebration, we reordered it to fill the

requests from the Newsletters and word of mouth excitement over the book. It is nearly sold out again! It was a thrilling occasion for us to reach our goal, once again, by presenting the ECSF Scholarship Fund last month with a donation from the proceeds of *Fast Forwards* as we have done with the other two books' sales.

We want to recognize Barbara Lyons who left an inheritance to her cousin Carol Lyons Larson '58, (who is also a cousin of Anita Wiggens Monette '58) one of the organizers of the Edison Authors. Carol donated some of it towards the publication of *Fast Forwards* knowing Barbara's strong interest in education. This was a wonderful way to share their good fortune for a worthy cause such as the Edison Scholarship fund.

Our next plan is to dedicate the final proceeds from the sale of the 3 books by the Edison Authors to award a scholarship for the next 3 years to an Edison student that has shown an interest in literature, writing, teaching, drama, theater and poetry (Literary Arts). Opportunities may be explored to see if there is interest in taking on such a project to continue this type of scholarship funding source.

Thank you to all our supporters that have helped us reach our goal. It has been an enjoyable adventuresome journey of fellowship, learning and accomplishment for all of us. The Edison Authors hopes our three books will be memorable vehicles for many generations to come and an inspiration to others to pursue a similar idea.

Update from Edison Principal Warne



Tommies have tradition! As staff and students continue to celebrate our 100-year anniversary, we have been reflecting on the traditions that are part of Edison's legacy. Ask almost anyone—current students and

staff, alumni, community members—what their favorite Edison tradition is, and they will tell you that they are most proud of our traditions of diversity and welcoming. From the flags in the hallways that represent the nations our students are from, to the graduation ceremony welcome message delivered in the native languages of our students and families, Edison values the diverse perspectives and experiences of our entire school community.

Every Wednesday at 2PM, I meet with our Student Leadership Team in the Alumni room. This group of young leaders represents the diversity of Edison perfectly. Black, brown, indigenous, and white students; students who speak Somali, Spanish, Oromo, and English; students who live in northeast, on the Northside, the Southside, the suburbs—they come together collaboratively, with distinct points of view, with varied histories, and with a shared love for their school community. These bright and bold student leaders inspire me, advise me, and make me a better Principal for Edison.

The Alumni room, where we meet each week, is beautifully decorated with artifacts and photographs that reflect our shared love for Edison and our shared capacity for leadership. What the Student Leadership Team and I hope it might *also* reflect, is the tradition of diversity at Edison of which we are all so proud. Just as our students are inspired by the legacy of the Guzy family, the Larson family, and other great leaders and

contributors to Edison, we hope that they also might be inspired by images and artifacts that represent our diverse history; that students on the leadership team might see themselves reflected in this room where they come together to build Edison's future.

As we learned from History teacher David Salzer and his storytelling crew's series "The Bulb", Edison is home to a plethora of special and inspiring stories. Our students are most inspired by the stories of people like Dr. Melvin Bates, Edison's first Black teacher who wrote his doctoral thesis on desegregation in public schools. In 1966, the Editors of The Wizard dedicated their yearbook to him. Or the story of Caroline Wanga, a Kenyan woman who graduated from Edison in 1995 and went on to be an entrepreneur and the CEO of Essence magazine. And the story of Nari Miller, 2022 graduate, who was the first female state champion in wrestling. What if their pictures, their stories, their letter jackets, hung alongside the pictures of our incredible Distinguished Alumni? What inspiration, hope, and affirmation might that provide our students?

Mr. Iacarella and I are ready to work together with our Student Leadership Team to make the Alumni Room a space that better reflects our tradition of diversity. We would love to hear from you—what stories, ideas, artifacts do you have in mind for inclusion in Room 104? Please send me your thoughts! Email me at
